## Training of Trainers

Dari 3hb hingga 11hb November, saya dan Shi Wei pergi ke MAKPEM untuk mengikuti kursus Disability Equality Training of Trainers (DET TOT). Seramai 16 orang yang terlibat mengikuti kursus tersebut. Peserta termasuk 6 dari Malaysia dari pelbagai organisasi, 4 dari Thailand, 3 dari Philippines, 2 dari India, 2 dari Nepal dan seorang dari Papua New Guinea. Kursus tersebut adalah untuk mengajar kami tentang DET dan juga tentang cara-cara yang terbaik sewaktu kami memberi DET training.

Semasa DET training, Dr Kenji Kuno (JICA Malaysia) telah mengajar saya apa itu "Individual Model" dan "Sosial Model". "Individual Model" menyatakan bahawa ketidakupayaan adalah akibat daripada keadaan physical atau mental seseorang dan cuba penyelesaian kepada ketidakupayaan tersebut melalui

perubatan dan rehabilitasi. "Social model" menyatakan bahawa ketidakupayaan adalah akibat halangan di persekitaran dan boleh ditangani dengan mengubah persekitaran supaya lebih *accessible* dan *inclusive*. Maksud kedua-dua perkataan "Individu Model" dan "Social Model" adalah perkataan baru bagi saya.

Dr Kenji juga telah mengajar saya bagaimana cara yang terbaik untuk memberi taklimat umpamanya, 'eyecontact' itu teramat penting sewaktu kita memberi taklimat. Dan menggunakan video dan slide show untuk mempersembahkan taklimat dengan lebih teliti.

Kita perlu mengadakan DET training kepada staff-staff dari syarikat-syarikat yang mengendali atau berkaitan dengan orang awam. Sebab OKU adalah sebahagian dalam masyarakat jadi mereka perlu tahu tentang bagaimana caranya untuk membantu kita.

Bagi pendapat saya, saya boleh memperbaiki latihan DET saya di Air Asia selepas mengikuti kursus ini dengan Dr Kenji.

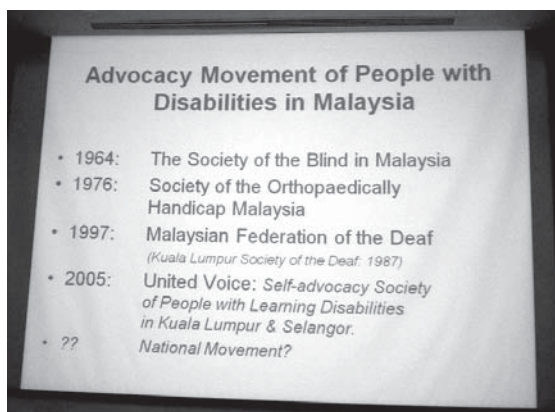
The speakers of the conference were Professor Dan Goodley and Dr Rebecca Lawthom from Manchester Metropolitan University, Dr Rebecca Millet from Sheffield Hallam University, Cik Noraini Hashim Director of Jabatan Pembangunan OKU, Mr Bong Muk Shin, Director of Special Education Division, Malaysia, Dr Ling How Kee from UNIMAS, Professor Osamu Nagase from University of Tokyo, Dr Kenji Kuno from JICA, Ms Ng Kui Choo from Universiti Teknologi Mara, Kuching, Dr Tsitsi Chaitaka, Ms Yeo Swee Lan, myself and many others.

I learned about Portage presented by Ms Ng Kui Choo. I like her talk. Very touching. Here are some information about Portage from Kui Choo's notes:

*Portage is a home-visiting service for pre-school children with additional support needs and their families. The first such scheme was developed in Portage, Wisconsin, USA in the early 1970s to meet the special needs of the young children living in rural communities. Portage services are committed to securing inclusion in the wider community for all children and families in their own right. I like what Kui Choo said, "Parents of children with disabilities need a lot of emotional support – they often feel desolate, alone and lost. And frustrated. We can help bring a ray of sunshine into the homes of children with disabilities." I hope there will be portage services in Malaysia soon.*

I felt honored to be given the privilege to be the first speaker. My topic was People with Learning Disabilities: Self-advocacy and Inclusive Education. I said that Self-Advocacy should be taught in school. It is important to teach Self-Advocacy in school because people with learning disabilities need to learn

1. Self-Awareness
2. Self-Confidence
3. Self-Determination
4. Self-Esteem
5. Knowledge of rights
6. Ability to integrate in the community

Children with learning disabilities should be given an opportunity to study in inclusive education. People with learning disabilities should be given opportunity to further their study in the higher learning institution or universities under the inclusive education.

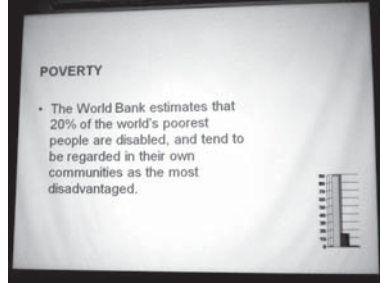
I studied in an inclusive education during my primary school days when I was in UK. But, when I came back to Malaysia, I could not study in the mainstream when I was in secondary school because there was no teacher

aid to support me. If I had a teacher aid, I should be able to cope in the mainstream class.

After school, I ended up in a sheltered job training centre. BUT, I wished I could go to college like people my age, where I can learn computer studies, hotel catering, performing art, music, etc. – I was not given a chance. I wish I could further my studies in higher learning institution or university to become more highly educated.

There was also a session in between the topics for supporting friends about how to support self-advocates and how to support a self-advocacy group by Swee Lan.

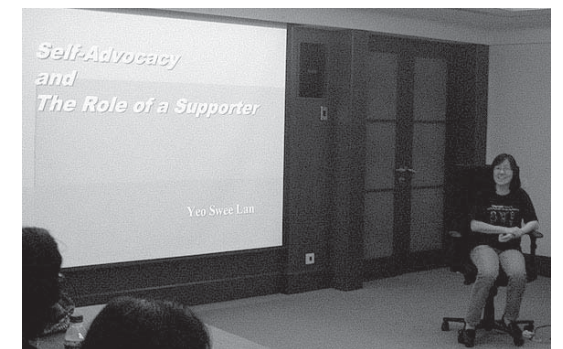

# Regional Conference on ASEAN & Disability, Jakarta, Indonesia

Pada 30 November 2010 saya dan Pn. Fadzillah tiba di LCCT pada pukul 7.30 pagi untuk terbang ke Jakarta, untuk menghadiri “ASEAN and Disability Conference” yang berlangsung pada 1 dan 2 December. Saya kurang puashati dengan layanan penerbangan Air Asia yang mempunyai bayaran berasingan bagi setiap perkhidmatan contohnya makanan, minum atau lain-lain keperluan. Ini adalah sebab jika di Malaysia perkataan cacat seperti merendah-rendahkan kumpulan ini. Bagaimana pun isu ini tidak dipersetujui kerana perkataan cacat adalah bahasa yang telah termaktub dengan Undang-undang di Indonesia.

Konferen tersebut telah dirasmikan oleh Menteri Kebajikan Indonesia. Dalam ucapan perasmianya, beliau menyatakan Kerajaan Indonesia sentiasa menyokong segala usaha berkaitan dengan OKU yang di anjurkan oleh Thailand dan Nippon Foundation dari Jepun. ii. Bilangan golongan OKU (PWD) seluruh negara Asean lebih kurang 60 juta. Golongan ini masih memerlukan sokongan dari sektor kerajaan dan swasta dalam merangka polisi kearah satu matlamat iaitu ‘Satu Komuniti, Satu Suara’.

iii. ASEAN disability forum juga sepatutnya dihadiri bersama wakil-wakil dari jabatan kerajaan, pertubuhan-pertubuhan sosial, media cetak, sektor perniagaan dan kumpulan akademi untuk sama-sama membantu pelbagai aspek keperluan dan perkhidmatan OKU yang relevan.

iv. Kerjasama dari semua peringkat dalam masyarakat serta memberi ruang dan peluang penglibatan OKU untuk menjadi sebahagian ahli masyarakat akan dapat memperkenalkan polisi ke arah memastikan kehidupan komuniti sosial OKU yang inklusif.

v. OKU juga digalakkan untuk mempelajari dan menggunakan kemudahan ICT dalam kehidupan seharian untuk maju seiring dengan arus kemajuan global.

Faedah yang saya dapati semasa menghadiri konferen ini adalah kesempatan bertemu sahabat baru, bertukar pendapat dan mengetahui perkembangan aktiviti OKU di negara ASEAN yang lain.

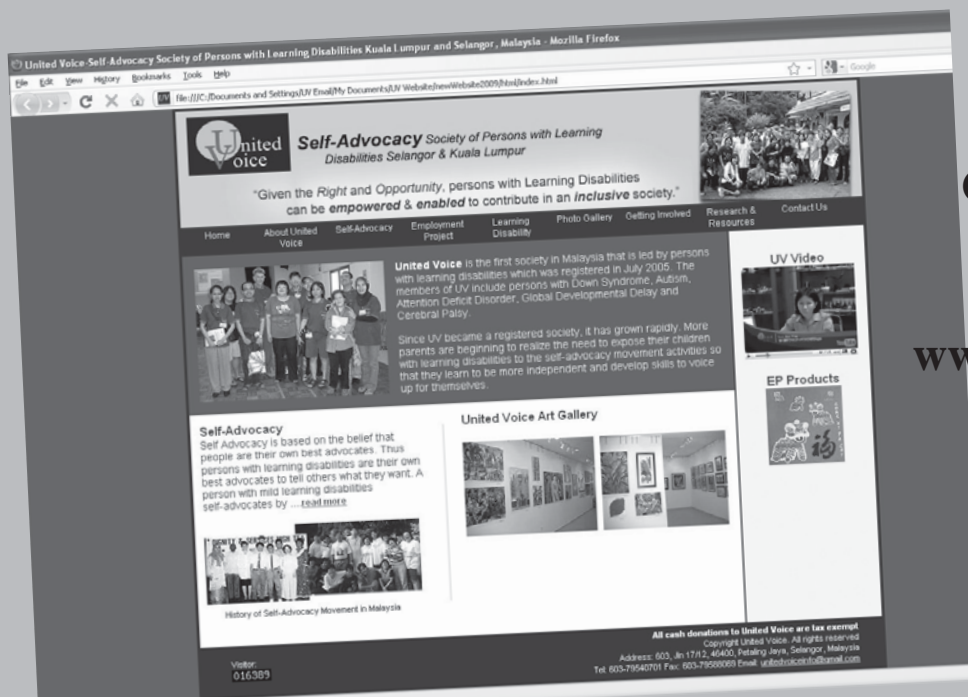
